Wrong Ball Play.

Recently a member wished to clarify the issue of Wrong Ball Play. I have attached a diagram which outlines the procedure to be followed when a wrong ball is played.

Briefly, if the striker plays opponents ball, replace and replay. If the striker hits partners ball or their second ball out of sequence then replace and replay or ball swap is the remedy. If partner plays strikers ball then replace and replay.

I am happy to discuss to clarify.

WRONG BALL PLAY REMEMBER TO FORESTALL ANY WRONG BALL PLAY (Rule 10.2.1)

EXAMPLE: Blue has just played the blue ball: Red is now the striker

^{1.} Replace and Replay (Rule 10.4.1)

All balls moved as a result of the last stroke are replaced, no hoops are made and striker plays

^{2.} Ball Swap (Rule 10.4.2)

All balls moved as a result of the last stroke are left where they stopped, the ball played in the last stroke and its partner ball are swapped, any hoops are counted, the non-offending side then plays the ball next in sequence. A swapped ball takes the offside status of the ball with which it is swapped.

^{3.} Penalty Area Continuation

The loser of a coin toss chooses which Penalty Area play will start from and the winner of the toss will start play with either ball of their side.
